

Dark Skies in the Mendip Hills AONB

In seeking to implement the Management Plan, the Mendip Hills AONB Partnership:

1. Encourages The Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) and The British Astronomical Association to continue their joint campaign against light pollution.
2. Urges our local MPs to raise the issue of diminishing dark skies in the AONB with appropriate Government Ministers.
3. Urges all Local Authority partners to:
 - a. adopt policies in Local Development Frameworks, highways policies, and other relevant strategies, to minimise and reduce existing light pollution affecting the AONB.
 - b. consider light pollution when dealing with planning applications e.g. influence the orientation and design of buildings to reduce the need for security lighting; promote sensitive lighting schemes.
4. Encourages and supports Parish Councils to continue existing and develop new initiatives towards addressing light pollution.
5. Urges everyone living and working in or near the AONB to use sensitive levels of lighting that avoid unnecessary light "spillage" which will also help to reduce their own energy costs.
